panes and leaded repoussé sheathing on the rear, animated the facades.

In the 1950s, the property, now known as Three Brooks after the three streams on the land feeding into Beaver Pond, was divided and another driveway added. In 1963 F. E. and Alice Church deeded part of their property, now known as the Shu Swamp Preserve, to the newly established North Shore Wildlife Sanctuary as a memorial to his brother. Both houses have been preserved and well maintained, and both are on to their fifth owner.
